2012: A YEAR OF CENTENARIES A new series of talks by local historian S Alex Blair

THE ULSTER COVENANT & ULSTER DAY: AN OVERVIEW Thurs 20 September, 8pm

28 September 1912 was designated Ulster Day and on that day many thousands signed the Ulster Covenant. They pledged themselves to oppose Home Rule for Ireland by using 'all means which may be found necessary'. It was a solemn and personal commitment, done after a religious service, and made a big impact across the whole British Empire.

In this month's talk, Mr Blair will give the general picture of these stirring days across Ulster and beyond.

THE ULSTER COVENANT AND **ULSTER DAY: THE LOCAL VIEW** Tue 30 October, 8pm

One of the few places where Ulster Day. 28th September 1912, did not bring out thousands was North Antrim. Described as 'rather a damp squib' in Ballymoney and with more opposition in Finvoy, the scene in North Antrim was very different from most other places across the province of Ulster.

Mr Blair investigates the reasons for this and looks at the other side of the Covenant story.



KENNEDY KANE MACARTHUR & HIS OLYMPIC MARATHON VICTORY OF 1912 ■

Local hero, Kennedy Kane McArthur's magnificent victory in the marathon race at the Stockholm Olympics in 1912 has been well documented this summer. As the centenary year draws to a close, Mr Blair will reflect on the Dervock man's outstanding achievement and on his life story, and with the advantage of having met and talked with McArthur's sister and niece many years ago, he will try and get as close as possible to the real McArthur.


